

## Browser's Bulletin 76:

### Lifestyle Blocks and the Importance of Preventative Strategies


Many people dream of having a lifestyle block with a menagerie of animals. Often the block size is small in comparison to the animal's requirements (nutrition, parasite management etc) and vaccinations and drenches come in large quantities that make them expensive to use. Hobby farmers love nothing more than breeding their livestock and building up their numbers, but unfortunately high stocking rates create even bigger issues.

The great news is that many diseases are preventable and simple measures can be put in place to stop these diseases before they create an issue in your stock. Procedures such as regular weigh-ins, hoof trimming, vaccinations, faecal egg counts, body condition scoring, FAMACHA checks, nutrition analysis, correct dose and timing of supplementations, lambing, kidding and unpacking preparation and emergency care. If possible, I would recommend that you work with your private veterinarian to create an 'Annual Health Plan'. An Annual Health Plan is an individual health care plan for your stock that will set out the timings of all management procedures, regular health checks of your animals in order to detect when an animal is going backwards before it is showing obvious clinical signs and gives you the chance to do something about it before the animal becomes too unwell. Unfortunately, your veterinarian often does not see your animals until they are very sick, and it is often too late.

Animal owners often turn to social media for all types of medical advice for their livestock. Online information is abundant but often not accurate and it is important if you have any questions about your animal's health to consult your veterinarian. A non-veterinarian does not have the intricate medical knowledge to diagnose a condition or disease, especially when many diseases have similar clinical signs. If you can establish a relationship with your veterinarian through regular routine health care and checkups, vaccinations and dentals, then they will be much more willing to offer advice over the phone or via email.

During 2023, we have encountered several cases where incorrect medical advice from fellow producers or social media producer groups has unfortunately led to the death of livestock. Most cases are from toxic levels of vitamins and minerals. Trace minerals in the animal should sit within a defined normal range in order to reach maximum productivity., Mineral levels that sit outside this range, either too low or too high, can cause illness and death.

The graph below demonstrates that when copper levels are low in goats they show signs of ill thrift, and death can occur, and when excessive copper supplementation causes copper levels that are too high it also results in death.

A recent case of over supplementation in a small ruminant has highlighted the issue of producers not seeking veterinary advice but rather following producer advice and not checking with a veterinarian. This animal received >11 times the recommended dose rate of a particular vitamin and > 5 times more doses that veterinarians recommend per annum. The animal died. I understand that livestock vets are few and far between in the Hunter Region, but this case highlights the importance of establishing a relationship with a veterinarian and incorporating preventative measures in managing your livestock. Ultimately your livestock will be healthier, and you will be getting the correct individual advice from your veterinarian.

#### Browser's Bulletin #74

#### Different Drench Families and their Mode of Action

The mode of action of each drench family works on the intestinal worms in a different way and consequently you can use multiple drench families at one time without causing toxicity to the animal. The effectiveness of each drench will differ with each property, depending on previous drench history and introduction of resistant worms.

We often recommend that producers use at least 2 drench families at one time but preferably 3 or 4 drench families, to prolong the life of each drench group on your property. Producers are often concerned that this recommendation is toxic to their livestock, but as long as each drench belongs to a different family then there is no issue if given at the correct dose rate and label instructions or veterinary prescription are followed. Using all drenches at one time means that you go down the race with one drench, followed by the next family and then the next. You do not mix them together in one container and then drench the animal. It is one after the other but all at the same time.

There are an array of drenches with different brand names, it is important to check the chemical in the drench and the family that chemical belongs to. Otherwise, you may be doubling up on the same family which could be toxic to your stock. Below are examples of four drenches that all contain abamectin and could not be used at the same time.

Combination drenches are also available, these types of drenches contain two or more active ingredients that target the same worms. Combining actives can substantially slow the development of drench resistance to those actives on your farm. Often it is an easier option to go down the path of a combination drench, than having multiple individual drenches. It is important to check the effectiveness of each drench family every 2-3 years.



This Browser's Bulletin was not written for you to remember the 'Mode of Action' of each drench family off by heart but merely to understand how each family of drench works on the intestinal worms and does not cause toxicity to your livestock when multiple families are used at one time.

Drench Families and their 'Mo	ode of Action'	
Family	Mode of action	Drench examples: brand and chemical name
Benzimidazole Group (BZ) White drench	Disrupts the cellular integrity of susceptible worms by inhibiting tubulin polymerization. This results in depletion of the worm's energy reserve and accumulation of waste products	Valbazen (Albendazole) Panacur 25 (Fenbendazole) Oxfen (Oxfenbendazole)
Levamisole (LEV) Clear drench	Paralyses susceptible worms by acting on nicotinic acetylcholine receptor agonists	Nilverm (Levamisole) Levamisole Gold (Levamisole)
Macrocyclic lactone (ML) 'Mectins'	Cause paralysis in the intestinal worm by binding to the glutamate-gated chloride channel receptor in the nematode and arthropod nerve cells	Ivomec & Noromectin (Ivermectin) Absolute, Vetmec, Paramectin (Abamectin) Cydectin, Moxitak (Moxidectin)
Amino-Acetonitrile derivatives AAD	Acts on specific nicotinic acetylcholine receptors. This is unique, as it is only found in nematodes. Binding of monepantel to the receptors causes irreversible paralysis of nematodes.	Zolvix (Monepantel)
Spiroindoles (SI)	Acts on a different nicotinic acetylcholine receptor located at the nematode neuromuscular junction and produces flaccid paralysis of the nematode.	Startect Derquantel + abamectin
Organophosphates (OP)	Disturbs the neuromuscular coordination in worms by inhibiting many enzymes, especially acetylcholinesterase	Rametin (naphthalophos)
TZ or Benzimidazole group (flukicide)	Narrow spectrum of activity against early immature, immature and adult liver fluke	Fasinex, Tremacide, Exifluke (Triclabendazole)
Salicylanilides/phenols (SA)	Uncouples oxidative phosphorylation in targeted worms, resulting in loss of cellular integrity	Closicare, WSD Closantel (Closantel)
Isoquinolones (IQ) Praziquantel	Unsure of the mode of action but causes integument (skin damage) and paralytic muscular contractions of cestode followed by their death and expulsion	Only available in combination drench with broad spectrum drench. Eg FirstDrench (Levamisole + Praziquantel), Genesis Tape (Abamectin + Praziquantel)
