



TICK BITE—"Natural Goat & Alpaca Care—Pat Coleby.

With tick bite the goat becomes lethargic and eventually goes into a coma. If carefully examined a tick(s) will be found. A dab of tea tree oil applied to the tick works wonders—it dies and lets go. Give the goat 10cc(5g) of vitamin C by injection; it is not too late if it is in a coma. If only oral C is obtainable, give three teaspoons in liquid slowly down the throat; take great care if comatose that it does not go down the windpipe.

There is apparently an antivenene, but it is not effective once the animal is in a coma. Friends with a tick-bitten dog, already comatose, were told by the vet it was already too late. Only then did they remember the oral vitamin C I told them about. They dribbled it down the dog's throat and it recovered very quickly.

Animals in tick areas eventually build up an immunity. It might be worth raising the goats' sulphur intake to an extra full teaspoon daily per week, so they would be less likely to be attacked. Stick-infested pastures are always on sour land that needs re-mineralising and looking after.

SULPHUR

This comes in the form of flowers of sulphur, obtainable from a chemist, or simply as sulphur from an industrial supplier. A deficiency in this element will cause an upsurge of exterior "lodgers", such as lice. It used to be adequate to give goats a teaspoon a month to keep this problem in check. However, as a result of more intensive farming, much of the wheat available (bran, pollards etc.) is now wholly sulphur deficient, and it now seems to be necessary to give up to a dessertspoon per week in some cases. An animal with adequate sulphur in its system may pick up the odd louse, but it will not breed or stay long. It is also helpful when goats, bucks especially, develop hard, dry skin; a teaspoon daily for a week will usually help clear this up quite effectively.

Hundreds of stolen goats seized by police in rural crime blitz

Eight people from western and southern parts of NSW have been charged with drug and rural crime offences following investigations which began in May last year.

PolAir raided multiple properties — across about 48,500 hectares (120,000 acres) — in the Murrumbidgee earlier this week, covering Bundure, Kidman Way at Mount Hope, Illawong and Landervale.

Officers found roughly 700 goats believed to be stolen.

Search warrants at properties in Cobar, Hillston and Mount Hope yesterday led to the arrest of eight people.

Four of the properties in Cobar contained methylamphetamine, cannabis plants, cannabis leaf, prescription medication, drug paraphernalia, property suspected of being stolen and liquid believed to be GHB.

At a Hillston property, officers seized methylamphetamine, cannabis, ammunition, and more than \$7000 cash.

Four men from Cobar, two men and one woman from Hilston and one man from Mount Hope were each charged with multiple offences.

The 33-year-old man Mount Hope man is believed to be involved in the theft and illegal trade of goats.

Murrumbidgee Police District Crime Manager, Detective Inspector Eugene Stek, said rural crime in New South Wales is a significant issue and has a huge economic impact.

"It's costing millions – not only in the theft of stock, but through the theft of other farming equipment, fuel and machinery, damaged fences, loss of income and it also introduces biosecurity risks," Inspector Stek said.

"What police will allege occurred here is that the goats were stolen from several properties and sold illegally.

"Farmers are the backbone of our country; this joint resolution shows that police will come at rural crime and drug offenders from all angles, and deal with them under the full force of the law."

Angora Herd for Mohair Noil

Raw *Mohair – Mohair* is shorn from the *Angora* goat twice a year. ... the *mohair* card sliver is then combed to remove the short fibers (*noils*)


Long standing breeders and past members of Mohair Australia Ltd, Ian and Rene Lockrey from Armidale NSW have been involved in this process for many years.

When Rene and Ian retired; for Jason and Naomi to keep up The Overseer saddles, they adopted 28 angora goats from their neighbours who were supplying the saddlery mohair.

As Rene has been processing the mohair for Jason and Naomi for many years she is continuing to carry out this process.

Mohair Noil is an essential part of "The Overseer" hair-lined stock saddles. It packs smoothly and doesn't felt like other products. They have used this mohair without fail for the last twenty years.

The mohair will pack down more in the front of the saddle where the rider's weight is; this could take 6-12 months. Then the saddle requires what is called at The Overseer Saddlery a top up—meaning they add more mohair over the top without disturbing the original mohair. This lifts the front of the saddle, putting the rider back on balance and the saddle, carrying weight for its whole length, as it did when it was new.

SERVICE THAT GUN - Vax gun, Drench gun or Backliner

While it is always important to check your drench gun setting by measuring a shot into a medicine glass, it is also just as important to be sure the gun is delivering the correct amount on each and every application of the gun. It must be consistent.

The most common causes for inconsistency are:-

- 1. Failure of the lever to return all the way back to the adjusting screw.
- 2. Sucking of air on the return stroke due to either worn seals or a breakage in pipe or cylinder wall.
- 3 Loss of liquid to the back of the plunger. This not only is a loss of the metered amount, but also eventually gets forced out completely and is wasted.

It would appear that most, if not all, of this type of equipment, is supplied or serviced by NJ Phillips who are in the industrial estate at Somersby, near Gosford NSW (02 4340 2044). Service kits are available either direct or through your local produce agent.

Advice from Phillips on the cleaning and assembly of this equipment stresses the use of castor oil only for the lubrication of the plunger parts and seals, after washing with detergent to remove drench liquids. The 'rubber' components will tend to go hard if castor oil is not used, or swell if other types of lubricants are used.

When assembling Vaxmaster type plungers with the two flat rubber washers, dust the washers with baby powder first. This absorbs any grease off fingers etc. and stops the tendency of the washers to be squeezed out when the plunger screw is tightened up against them. Do not over tighten.

Once the plunger is assembled, castor oil can be applied to lubricate the plunger in the cylinder. If sterilisation is necessary prior to vaccination, assemble in water and boil with water in the cylinder. Re-assemble in castor oil after clean up following vaccination.
